1. Approve Agenda	Meeting began at 3:48 pm. Agenda was reviewed and approved.	
2. Review 11/14/2018 Minutes	November minutes reviewed and also approved with no changes.	
3. SLO Handbook/Resources	<p>Nathan displayed the SLO handbook on the screen.</p> <p>Phil asked the group to discuss and look for things that they liked, because as it's very easy to find things that we don't like and more difficult to find things that they do like. He opened the discussion up for feedback from the group. He reminded those in attendance that the topic was previously discussed about having the balance of comprehensive set of resources available for people and balancing that with the amount of work it takes to keep something like it up-to-date & maintained.</p> <p>Ideas were shared and discussed. Phil and Nathan facilitated. Many thoughts were brainstormed and noted by Nathan.</p> <p>Have a visual depiction with examples for people to click on and go directly to that form or topic.</p>	<p>Post the forms on the websites with only one link to each department. Also have a link to where you input and a link to the google form.</p> <p>Archive old versions of handbook.</p>
4. Curriculum SLO Process	<p>Nathan gave an update on the Curriculum Committee's process for dealing with SLOs. He said that they [Nathan and Asher] are trying to find a way to make the process more efficient and more effective for when faculty change their SLOs or PSLOs.</p> <p>He said that the latest information that he got from attending the Curriculum Committee meetings is that they would prefer that the COG</p>	

	<p>group handle it and be autonomous from them. A discussion regarding SLOs in the curriculum process continued along with how to enforce that courses complete their SLOs according to Accreditation standards. Nathan facilitated that discussion and explained his understanding of the process since he has been co-chair.</p> <p>He added that he feels that the process should be automated and the Curriculum Committee is not going to assess the quality of the SLOs. He likes for the process to be quick, but he has nothing to compare it to, because he was not part of how it was done previously.</p> <p>Another discussion ensued regarding where SLOs are in the process with not only Curriculum but also with Technical Review process.</p> <p>As of today, there are still 20 disciplines and 5 service areas that still have something out.</p>

ISLO/ISUO Assessments</p>	<p>This a bigger topic than many can deal with; put out there to think about for next meeting;</p> <p>Asked the questions: How do we want to have the forum about ISLO? 1pm-5pm? What does it need to look like if we want to do something new?</p>	<p>Will discuss at next meeting.</p>
