Lending Library and Reserves

Help keep textbook costs down for students - refer them to the Lending Library and Reserves! What are those?

The Lending Library consists of textbooks that students can check out for the entire semester. While we don't have every textbook, we have many from core classes that most students have to take including English, Math, Languages, and more. Reserve books are textbooks that students can check out for 2 hours at a time. We have most textbooks and if we do not have one, in most cases we can purchase one to place on reserve.
