Dear Ron Mules,

Thank you for all the work you put into completing your comprehensive program review. It has been reviewed by the College Planning Committee and the Executive Team. The College Planning Committee feedback is attached. Below, you will find comments, commendations, and recommendations from the Executive Team. These are provided for incorporation into your annual program planning processes. Typically, recommendations require planning improvements that will be implemented over time. Thus, in your subsequent annual mini-reviews, you will want to provide updates on progress made towards addressing these recommendations.

Comments:

The Behavioral Sciences Department includes the academic disciples of Psychology, Sociology, Philosophy, Social Work/Human Services and Modern Languages. These disciplines have a wide range of applications in the workplace and provide important critical thinking skills that apply to work and meet the needs of students transferring. This program makes up 10% of student enrollment. While enrollment is lower than before the pandemic, the program currently has higher than average enrollment and the student body reflects the overall student population. In the coming years we expect to see significant activity in this program and department as we implement CalGETC (AB 928), offer online PACE programs, implement common course numbering (AB 1111), advance in CVC (California Virtual Campus) offerings, expand ZTC (Zero Textbook Costs) offerings, and consider new high-demand areas like psychiatric technology, data analytics, and public administration, to name a couple. The future is unclear and holds great, positive potential for the Behavioral Sciences program.

Commendations:

- 1. Overall, success rates are improving, and in several areas, equity gaps are narrowing. Psychology has excellent success rates.
- 2. The effectively provides students with access to courses to fulfill their UC/CSU requirements.
- 3. The program produces the 2nd and 5th highest number of degrees (Psychology and Sociology, respectively). This serves as a great need and opportunity for our students overall at VC.

Recommendations:

- Monitor effects of AB928 and plan to respond to maintain enrollments and support student success by way of considering: developing new in-demand programs (CTE and ADT's); integrating classes and programs into relevant dual enrollment opportunities; offering indemand courses and programs in a PACE format, etc. Additionally, and related to AB 928, we will need to support the growth of Ethnic Studies areas with appropriate faculty staffing to meet the demand.
- 2. Male students transfer at a significantly lower rate than do female students. (Approximately 12% difference). Consider engaging in targeted PD that supports the retention and recruitment of male students, in particular men of color (as per the Student Equity Plan).
- 3. Course success rates by ethnicity vary significantly among the disciplines. Native American, White, and Asian students experience the highest success rates (81%-89%), yet Black and Hispanic students experience the greatest barriers to success in this program's classes (60%-73%). Consider engaging in targeted PD that supports the retention and recruitment of marginalized students of color, including engaging in the campus HSI (Hispanic Serving Institutions) efforts, and *possibly* engaging in other data-informed, proven PD methods that support the inclusion, cultural affirmation, and success of Black and Brown students as well as returning and older (age 25+) students.

CPC's overall recommendation is *Strengthen the Program*, to which I concur. Thank you again for your dedicated work in improving outcomes for our students.

They need more help!!!


Certain programs within Behavioral Science need to advertise.
